Number 1:

Well, the big news today is the announcement of yet another hack at Yahoo. This time, information from more than a billion accounts were than stolen and this actually happened back in August 2013, before the hack reported earlier this year. If you have a Yahoo account, you should have received an email from the company stating, "The stolen user account information may have included names, email addresses, telephone numbers, dates of birth, hashed passwords (using MD5) and, in some cases, encrypted or unencrypted security questions and answers."

I've got a link in the show notes to an article with information about how to protect yourself going forward, but a simple Google search on "yahoo hack" will bring up a bunch more.

Number 2:

It's getting difficult to keep up with all the options now available for streaming live videos from social media apps. Twitter has just joined the ranks of services offering this feature. But wait, what about Periscope? you may be asking, since it's owned by Twitter. Well, Periscope is still around, but Twitter has now built live streaming directly into the Twitter app on Android and iOS devices—no Periscope app required. And yes... That is clear as mud.

If you've got a Windows 10 PC and want to use Cortana, Microsoft's voice-based smart assistant, you need to connect to their cloud service for it to work. But if you're logging into your computer with a local account instead of a Microsoft account, you can set it up so that only Cortana is connected to the cloud—not your entire PC.
